RESULTS OF OPENING WEEK OF THE 50TH RENCONTRES D'ARLES JULY 1 TO 6 2019

From around the world, more professionals and journalists than ever came to the 50th Rencontres d'Arles.



19,000 festival-goers from Monday July 1 to Saturday July 6

Overall attendance rose by 3%. Professionals: +13% Sales of all-inclusive passes: +8% Visitors preferred passes to individual exhibition tickets: -20%. To date, online presales for exhibitions have increased by over 13%.

On Monday July 1, Minister of Culture Franck Riester opened the 50th Rencontres d'Arles accompanied by former culture ministers Jack Lang, Aurélie Filipetti and Françoise Nyssen.

Under the sign of celebration, the festival paid homage to its founders, in particular by affixing a plaque in honor of Lucien Clergue.

The festival has always supported young artists and this year opening week was the occasion to inaugurate the new buildings of the École Nationale Supérieure de la Photographie by the minister of culture and its new director, Marta Gili.

Carrying on its trailblazing spirit, the Rencontres opened a new venue near the train station, the Garden, which hosted an outdoor show for the first time.

The Rencontres features Lebanon's culinary riche at *Tawlet*, the gastronomic and solidarity canteen at Croisière.

KEY FIGURES

19,000 visitors

Fifty-one exhibitions on the official program, six on the associated program and 15 as part of the Grand Arles Express, which travels from Marseille to Avignon, Cavaillon, Nîmes, Isle-sur-la-Sorgue, Port De Bouc and Toulon.

43 curators

210 artists

33 venues: 26 exhibition venues and seven sites that hosted public events and multidisciplinary performances.

110 public events: guided tours with artists and curators, book signings, lectures, live France Inter and France Culture broadcasts, projections, tastings, etc.

40 French and international publishers at Temple Arles Books.

PHOTOGRAPHY NIGHTS

At nightfall, the ancient theater, cloisters, churches and abandoned industrial sites became unique settings to stage images.

This year the festival hosted four free evening events:

- On Monday July 1, a big opening night party at Croisière and on boulevard Émile Combe with 11 photo studios, installations, inventions and 20 artists' projections drew 6,000 people.

- On Wednesday July 3, the Literature and Photography program featured readings and a literary dance.

- On Friday July 5, the Night of the Year brought together 7,000 people at Papeteries Étienne.

- On Saturday July 6, 3,700 people attended the closing night party co-produced by the

Rencontres d'Arles, the Luma Foundation and Suds.

Three exceptional evenings at the ancient theater attracted over 1,500 people each: Tuesday July 3 with Susan Meiselas, winner of the first Women In Motion Award for Photography, created by Kering and the Rencontres d'Arles; Thursday July 5 with Gaëtan Roussel; Saturday July 6 with the Rencontres Live Magazine.

Three evenings appealing to the Five Senses: singer Gaëtan Roussel, chef Yves Camdeborde and winemaker Éric Pfifferling offered a blind tasting set to music and in relation to an exhibition.

Fanton Nights: for the first time, Tënk, an online documentary platform, and the Rencontres turned the Fanton courtyard into an outdoor cinema where over 150 people watched 11 documentary films every night.

THE WOMEN IN MOTION AWARD FOR PHOTOGRAPHY

Kering, in partnership with the Rencontres d'Arles, launched the *Women In Motion* program for photography to contribute to the recognition of female photographers and to advance gender equality in all areas of the arts.

Susan Meiselas

The *Women In Motion* Award, which recognizes the career of an iconic female photographer, is accompanied by a grant of €25,000 for the acquisition of works by Susan Meiselas, enriching the photographic collection of the Rencontres d'Arles.

THE LOUIS ROEDERER DISCOVERY AWARD

Two winners tied for first place: Máté Bartha For *Kontakt* Proposed by the Galerie Tobe, Budapest, Hungary. and Laure Tiberghien for *Suite...* Proposed by the Lumière des Roses gallery, Montreuil, France.

The Public's Award: Alys Tomlinson for Les Fidèles

The Jury's Award comes with the amount of €15,000 to be shared between the two winners for the acquisition of works that will enter the Rencontres d'Arles collection and €5,000 for the Public's Award.
